Shall the Board of Education of the Lone Jack C-6 School District, Missouri, be authorized to increase the operating tax levy by \$0.2436 to \$3.4737 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation in order to provide additional funds to attract and retain quality certified and support staff, maintain its facilities, and meet the operating expenses of the District?
