QUESTION 1

Shall Fort Osage R-1 School District of Jackson County, Missouri issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$20,000,000, resulting in no estimated increase to the debt service tax levy, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, repairing, renovating, furnishing and equipping school facilities, including:

- renovating kitchen facilities at all five elementary schools, Fire Prairie Upper Elementary School, Osage Trail Middle School and Fort Osage High School
- constructing a transportation/maintenance/District office building
- making improvements to parking lots and drives at Blue Hills Elementary School, Fire Prairie Upper Elementary School, Osage Trail Middle School, Career and Technology Center and Fort Osage High School to improve traffic flow and safety?

If this question is approved, the District's debt service tax levy is estimated to remain unchanged at \$1.5418 per \$100 of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

QUESTION 2

Shall the Board of Education of Fort Osage R-1 School District of Jackson County, Missouri be authorized to increase the operating tax levy ceiling to \$5.0282 per \$100 of assessed valuation in 2021, to \$5.0882 per \$100 of assessed valuation in 2022 and to \$5.1482 in 2023 and thereafter for operating expenses and funding capital projects of the District, including constructing a new gymnasium at the High School and remodeling and expanding the High School band room?

If this question is approved, the adjusted operating tax levy of the District is estimated to increase by \$0.20 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning in 2021, by an additional \$0.06 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning in 2022 and by an additional \$0.06 per \$100 of assessed valuation beginning in 2023. In connection therewith, the District expects to make corresponding reductions to its debt service tax levy of \$0.20 per \$100 of assessed valuation in 2021, \$0.06 per \$100 of assessed valuation in 2023.

This would result in the estimated overall tax levy of the District to remain unchanged.

NOTICE OF ACCESSIBILITY
